As Companions, they become mentors and role models for Junior Achievement youth and Canada's future business leaders.

Inductees are selected by an independent Selection Committee representing Canada's foremost business, academic and media institutions. Through a public call for nominations, candidates are submitted to Knightsbridge Human Capital Solutions, and presented for consideration to the Selection Committee.

ORDER of THE
Business Hall of Fame

The Order of the Business Hall of Fame honours the outstanding contributions of Canadian business leaders to the economic growth and development of our nation, and in so doing, provides role models to enterprising young Canadians for generations to come.

The Inductees' entrepreneurial and management skills, vision, determination, and perseverance have helped to shape Canada. The jobs they have created and the products and services they have developed play a significant role in maintaining our high standard of living. As leaders and mentors, the Inductees have earned the respect of their peers for their integrity and sound business ethics.

All nominees must have been born in Canada or have become naturalized Canadian citizens. They must have demonstrated national business involvement and attained senior status in the enterprise in which they gained prominence.

The following additional criteria are set out as guidelines for your nomination:

- 1. Vision and Leadership** — A successful candidate will have demonstrated outstanding leadership and vision at the helm of one or more business organizations over many years, applying experience, insight and leadership qualities to initiatives that have led the organization to measurable new heights of success. He/She will be commonly recognized and applauded for these initiatives and for his/her overall legacy.
- 2. National Impact** — The Nominee will have had an impact on the Canadian economy through verifiable financial success, job creation, expansion and innovation. Challenges encountered along the way have been overcome through vision and determination.

3. Civic Leadership — The Nominee will have utilized his/her influence and energy to further Canadian social and economic wellbeing, as demonstrated through leadership in philanthropy or in community-based initiatives.

4. Role Model — The Nominee will be widely respected by his/her peers and will be considered an excellent role model for enterprising young Canadians. His/Her integrity and business ethics have made a recognizable contribution to improving respect for Canadian business.

The Canadian Business Hall of Fame recognizes the important contributions made by all members of Canada's diverse business community. Nominations that reflect our current leadership character are welcomed and encouraged.

Requirements and Nomination Process

Specific requirements for induction include:

- Attendance and media participation at the Announcement Luncheon, in November in Toronto.
- Attendance and media participation during afternoon and evening events at the Gala Dinner Induction Ceremony in Toronto.
- Participation in advocacy for the Canadian Business Hall of Fame and Junior Achievement of Canada.

Please ensure that your Nominee has agreed to let his/her name stand for nomination. Nominations will be compiled by our executive search firm, Knightsbridge, and presented for review by an independent selection committee. Some of Canada's foremost business, academic and media leaders comprise this year's distinguished panel. Inductees will be announced at the Announcement Luncheon and press conference and will have their post-nominal designations bestowed at the Business Hall of Fame Gala Dinner Induction Ceremony in Toronto.
